Women of the ELCA Purpose Statement

As a community of women created in the image of God, called to discipleship in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to grow in faith, affirm our gifts, support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the church, the society, and the world.

Worship & Offerings -- The Love Offering will be taken at the door prior to the Worship Service and the VSWO Offering will be received as offering during the service.

The Love Offering will be divided between two organizations that our host church supports: WATTS and CCAP. WATTS provides temporary shelter and other services to the homeless. CCAP offers a food pantry and clothing distribution.

Voting Member Travel Expenses

- Voting members' attendance at all sessions is a prerequisite to payment of travel expenses.
- Voting members shall submit vouchers to the Committee on Claims by end of Friday's Business Session.
- Travel vouchers shall be paid by the Committee on Claims at lunch Saturday.
- If public transportation is used, the least expensive shall be employed. If private transportation is used, reimbursement shall be at a rate of 15 cents per mile per vehicle. Tolls for turnpikes or tunnels are not allowable.
- Each unit, whether represented or not, shall be asked to contribute \$25 to the Fair Share Travel Fund.
- Only voting members whose units have paid the 2018 contribution to the Fair Share Travel Fund prior to August 3rd are eligible to receive travel expense checks.

Rules of Procedure for the Convention

Representation

Voting members of a convention shall be the elected officers and board members of the Virginia Synodical Women's Organization (VSWO) and one voting member from each unit on the roll of the VSWO.

Seat and Voice

The following shall have seat and voice (no voting privileges) in the convention:

- Those congregations not represented by a unit shall be invited to send one representative to the convention:
- Bishop of the Synod or his representative;
- Churchwide Women's Organization (CWO) Representative; and
- Others to whom the voting body shall give this privilege.

Voting Members

- Shall attend voting member orientation with Jody Smiley.
- Shall be registered before being seated in the area reserved for the voting body.
- Shall not absent themselves from the convention without permission of the President;
- Shall wear badges at all business meetings;
- Shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with the Fair Share Travel Fund.
- Shall report to the Registrar should an emergency require departure and relinquish badge. The alternate, if present, shall be re-registered and issued a delegate's badge;
- Shall be seated by 1:00pm, Friday, August 3, 2018

Speeches

Speeches shall be limited to two (2) minutes unless otherwise determined by a two-thirds vote of the convention.

Elections:

Vice-President, Secretary, and two Board members (2-year term).

Motions and Resolutions

- Any voting member may make a motion which is germane to any pending question. Motion shall then be written on the form provided to voting members and submitted to the VSWO Secretary.
- Resolutions of a general nature shall be written on the form provided, signed by two voting members and submitted to the VSWO Secretary prior to start of business Friday August 3rd. Resolutions will be received by the Secretary and referred to the Committee on Reference and Counsel.
- Each voting member who offers a resolution shall be given an opportunity to explain it to the Committee on Reference and Counsel.

Parliamentary Procedures

Robert Rules of Order (R.R.), latest edition, shall be the governing parliamentary law of the convention in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are consistent with the Constitution and Bylaws of the VSWO.

Addressing the Assembly

- Each voting member should stand, address the chair ("Madame President"), state her name and congregation, and receive "recognition from the chair." (R.R.)
- All Comments should be directed to the "chair." (R.R.)

Limitations on Debate

- Each voting member may speak twice on the same question on the same day, but should not make a second speech on the same question so long as any voting member who has not spoken on that question desires the floor. (R.R.)
- Any voting member, feeling that debate should be stopped, may request the convention to do so by obtaining the floor and moving the "previous question." If this is seconded and convention decides by a two-thirds vote in favor, then debate is stopped and the vote is taken on the pending question. (R.R.)
- Calls for "questions" by members from their seats are not motions for the Previous. They are simply informal expressions of individual members' desires to proceed to a vote. These calls are disorderly if made while another member is speaking or seeking recognition. (R.R.)

WE, the Virginia Synodical Women's Organization, Women of the ELCA, are entering the 32nd year of service and ministry together, and we are gathering this year to refresh our spirits and enrich our ministry together.

Virginia Synodical Women's Organizational Convention 2017

The 30th annual convention of Virginia Synodical Women's Organization was held at St Philip Lutheran Church, Roanoke, August 18-19, 2017. The theme was "Renewal of Spirit: All Anew". The convention scripture was Romans 12: 1-2. We had convention voting strength of 33 (4 officers, 5 board members, and 24 voting members) and 38 participants, and 8 guests for a convention total of 79. The Women of the ELCA Churchwide Representative was Gwen Edwards from the Northwestern Minnesota Synod. She brought greetings from the Women of the ELCA staff and board. The Rev. Kelly Derrick presided over a spirit- filled worship service and provided a wonderful, engaging bible study.

The 2017 convention had many highlights. Our love offering of \$1625.00 was split between Elijah's Backpack and Katie's Fund. Conferences also gave \$1457.00 to be divided equally between the VSWO & WELCA. The response to the service projects continues to be overwhelming. Sole Hope project: 941 shoe cutouts and \$10493.79 in monetary donations. Grace Inside: 18,449 cards plus 670 stamps, notepads, and \$590 cash donation.

Outgoing Bishop Jim Mauney served as Keynote Speaker. We were honored that he chose our event as his last official stop. As a thank you for his service, \$528 in donations was collected towards the Forwarding Faith campaign.

The 2018-19 VSWO budget was presented and approved.

Jody Smiley was elected as President. Edith Blake was re-elected as Treasurer. Nominees elected for two-year Board terms were: Sylvia Ely from First, Portsmouth; Ellen Greene from St John, Norfolk; Michelle Poore from Trinity, Pulaski; and Linda Lowry from Morning Star, Luray. Bonnie Mantta was elected to fill a one-year term.

Powerful; Inspiring; Educational; Spirit-led/spirit-filled – all words that describe our Awareness Session offerings. They included:

- o Bible Study led by Rev. Kelly Derrick
- o The VA Tech April 16th Tragedy: How a campus moves from sadness and disbelief to a renewal of spirit led by Jody Smiley
- o Meditation with instructor Colleen Carrell
- o C.A.R.E. led by Ellen Greene and Edith Blake

Healthy Congregations led by Mindy Reynolds

A resolution titled "Ending Racial Injustice" was adopted by the voting members. It directed units to have at least one activity utilizing the Women of the ELCA resource, "How to have helpful conversations about race in the church."

Lisa Taglauer, Outgoing President of the VSWO, gave an emotional, heart-felt message entitled, "Renewing Your Spirit." She motivated the attendees to continue their active involvement in the VSWO and WELCA and to encourage others to join in our efforts.

Board Meetings

The VSWO board met in November, March and June. We also held a conference call in May. All board meetings were held at St Marks in Charlottesville. Thank you to the St Marks community for welcoming us into your space. During these meetings, our board conducts the necessary business, planning, goal setting, and visioning that is needed for the work of our organization.

Young Women Guest Program

Noting the declining participation in the Young Women Guest Program, the Board agreed to focus on increasing awareness and participation among rostered women leaders in the Synod. To that end, we sent invitations to all and committed to covering their registration.

2019 VSWO Site Selection

We considered, contacted, or visited the following churches in Tidewater Conference in Virginia Beach: Emmanuel, Our Saviour, St. Michael, Good Shepherd; and Gloria Dei, Trinity, and St.Paul in Peninsula Conference. These churches either did not want to host us or their facility or equipment was not adequate for our needs.

First Lutheran, Norfolk will most completely fill our needs. They have plenty of parking, plenty of meeting rooms that are handicap accessible and a beautiful sanctuary with organ and piano. The

main meeting room will be on the third floor which is reachable by two elevators. The kitchen is on that floor and we could order box lunches from Panera. We would eat in the meeting room where there is capablilty for Power Point Presentations and a mic. There are plenty of restrooms and a copier on that floor. There is no piano on that floor so music other than during worship would have to be A capella.

The church will be available on Thursday night and their very large parlor on the first floor will have plenty of space for the board. The room is close to the copier that we could use.

Lisa Geiger (LGEIGER@FLCNORFOLK.COM) is the Church Operations Manager and was very willing to help in any way. Sylvia Eley, part-time administrator, will be of great assistance. Pastor Kathy Mims is the assistant.

Norfolk has many hotels within ten minutes, but the Springhill Suites, 4500 Hampton Blvd (at Old Dominion) would be the easiest to reach. It is a five-minute drive to the church. To continue the historic Reformation Celebration of 2017, the Germanna Women's Spring Gathering, "Why This Church Here? Our Virginia Heritage" was held at Hebron Lutheran Church in Madison, VA on a beautiful spring Saturday, April 28, 2018. Twenty-one women from six congregations worshipped in the beautiful building and then listened to Judy Ann Fray, member of Hebron, speak on the history of Hebron, the oldest Lutheran Church in the United States in over 300 years of continuous use. The beautiful church building of Hebron is on the U.S. National Register of Historic Places and on the Virginia Landmarks Register. A member of each church represented had the opportunity to share a very brief history of their congregation beginning with the youngest and concluding with Judy Ann's presentation. A luncheon and business meeting concluded the morning with the three members of the planning committee installed by Jody Smiley, president of VSWO.

New River District Fall Gathering was hosted by Our Saviour, Christiansburg with new Pastor, Rev. Wanda Childs leading worship with the "An Ever Present Help in Trouble Liturgy" written in fall hurricane season. Our offering of \$388.00 to VSWO to help support women's programs. The special offering of \$1,305.00 sent to Faith Lutheran Church, Dickinson, TX, heavily damaged by hurricane Harvey. We decided to help them replace craft materials and a sewing machine, they use to make crafts, which help support their Ark Book Pantry and community outreach projects. We each made prayer beads which were sent along with our donation to show our support and love to their members. NRV once again collected Christmas shoeboxes at the Gathering for Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. There were 276 shoeboxes from the NRV churches, Christ the King in Richmond and St. John Lutheran in Lexington SC. St. Michael's Party with a Purpose prepared all the shoeboxes for shipping. This was the 25th anniversary year of the program begun by Christ Episcopal Church, Blacksburg. They held an anniversary supper, with some history and stories about earlier years, followed by stuffing 304 backpacks, all accompanied by drummers playing a huge Indian drum. The combined backpacks and shoeboxes were a record 2,100 lbs when shipped. Additional items were shipped to the homeless shelter program at the Reservation.

- Collected food, cleaning supplies etc. for food banks, Women's Resource Center, and community groups

Through Holy Baptism, you were gathered into the family of God and called to minister to others, and through your election, you have been chosen to serve as leaders of Women of the ELCA. May God work through you to share hope and healing with the world in which you live. God is faithful and will graciously enable you to fulfill your task. May God's blessing give you peace.

Addressing those being installed:

I now declare you installed as officers and board members of the Virginia Synodical Women's Organization of Women of the ELCA, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Continuing with prayer.

Let us pray.

Loving God, surround these women with your life-giving Spirit, inspiring them to love and serve all creation. Make them bold and courageous, Holy God, that they may help the women of this organization fulfill our mission and purpose. We ask this in the name of Jesus.

Amen.

Addressing the assembly:

Let us stand in recognition and appreciation of these women for their gifts to God and to Women of the ELCA.

The officers and board members return to their seats.
