She has worked as a chaplain in Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women for more than a decade, served a woman on death row, and she now works to help bring prison ministry needs to the attention of us all. Human Trafficking—Kristen Snelgrove

Human trafficking is a worldwide epidemic that is now receiving national attention, and the ELCA has decided to take it on as one of their Justice initiatives. The people who are holding and selling these victims do not discriminate against age, sex, or socioeconomic status. Everyone can be a potential victim in their eyes. The most alarming statistic for me is the number of children that are victims of this modern day slavery. It is estimated that one out of every six runaways become victims of human trafficking and 26% of this multi-billion dollar industry is made up of children. That means that of the 20.9 million people that are trafficked, 5.4 million of them are children. At our upcoming convention I will be leading an awareness session to help you learn who these victims are, how to spot them, and how to help them. The number of victims reaching out for help has grown since last year, we all need to be ready to listen to help stop this atrocious practice.

It is hard to believe but at our convention in August we will be electing four voting members (and alternates) to represent the VSWO at the 10th Triennial Convention. The convention will be held July 11-13, 2017 in Minneapolis, MN.

Nomination forms will be in the upcoming Call to Convention and we need your help. It is very important that we have enough nominations not only to fill the four voting member positions but to have alternates for each. These women are elected a full year before the Triennial Convention and as we have seen in the past a lot can happen in a year.

Our constitution helps guide us through the process. Nominations for voting members must be made by the congregational unit. Each unit can only submit the name of one of its participants. Also as nearly as possible, at least one of our delegates shall be a person of color or whose primary language is other than English and one of the voting members shall be attending the convention for the first time. To achieve this, a rank-order process established by the Churchwide Women's Organization Executive Board is used.

Please prayerfully consider and discuss this in your congregational units in the coming months. This is your organization and this is your opportunity to have a voice in determining the activities and direction of Women of the ELCA. Where we go and what we do as a churchwide organization will be shaped, in part, by the voting members of the Tenth Triennial Convention.
